

## Bike Map

Not to Scale. Intended as an Overview. Please consult a more detailed map so that you don't get lost on a back road.

1 Armstrong Redwoods/Austin Creek State Recreation Area (Guerneville)

> Easy - 1.5-mile paved loop through Armstrong Redwoods State Park. Difficult - 3-mile steep paved loop to Bull Frog Pond in Austin Creek State Recreation Area.

"Levi's Loop" - Levi Leipheimer's Favorite Local Ride (Graton/ Occidental/Bodega Bay)

Difficult - 40-mile challenging ride that starts by heading west on Green Valley Road in Graton. Turn left onto Harrison Grade and go through the town of Occidental. Take Coleman Valley Road to Highway 1 and head south. In Bodega Bay, take Bay Hill Road back to Highway 1, then take a left onto the Bodega Highway. Turn left on Joy Road, then right on Bittner Road, back through Occidental, returning to Graton on Occidental Road.

(3) Colgan Creek Trail (Santa Rosa)

*Easy* - This 1.2 mile trail starts at the intersection of Stony Point Road and Todd Roads and ends at Bellvue Avenue.

West Dry Creek and Dry Creek Roads (Healdsburg)

Moderate - Starting downtown, take Westside Road out of town. Take a right on West Dry Creek Road. Cross over to Dry Creek Road at Lambert Bridge Road, or, if you want a longer ride, at Yoakim Bridge Road. Take a right onto Dry Creek Road and follow back into Healdsburg.

5 The Geysers (Geyserville)

Difficult - From downtown, take Geyserville Avenue/128 north (becoming Asti Road). Take a right on E. 1st Street/Crocker St., crossing the River. Take a left on River Road, which ends at Geysers Road. Take a right and get ready for 42 miles of hills before taking a left on Red Winery Road. Take a right on Pine Flat Road to get you onto Hwy 128/Alexander Valley Road and back to yourstarting point.

6 Red Winery Road (Geyserville)

*Easy* - A beautiful ride on a road lined with vineyards and wineries.

7 King Ridge Road (Cazadero)

**Difficult** - Stretching from Cazadero to the coast, King Ridge Road is a grueling ride - but you are rewarded with some of the most beautiful views in Sonoma County.

8 West County Trail (Forestville to Santa Rosa)

Easy - A wide, paved trail beginning in downtown Forestville and ending at the intersection of Mill Station Road and Highway 116 in Sebastopol (where you can continue on to Santa Rosa on the Joe Rodota Trail)..

Joe Rodota Trail (Sebastopol - Santa Rosa)

Easy - Start at the intersection of Mill Station Road and Highway 116 in Sebastopol and enjoy miles of paved trail, ending at the pedestrian/bicycle bridge intersection with the Prince Memorial Greenway (between West 3rd Street and Railroad Street), southwest of the Marriott Courtyard Hotel.
